What makes this picturesque neighbourhood so pleasing to the eye? Well, it might have something to do with the many golf courses, green spaces and mountain vistas. Or the fact that it's home to the largest grove of Redwood trees north of California, a thriving arts community and (by no coincidence) a number of artists!

South Surrey is home to **Crescent Beach** and its beachfront promenade, a summer destination favourite that offers breathtaking views, a place to sunbathe and every water activity imaginable. It's also a pretty great place for making special memories.

But just how 'south' is South Surrey? Well, the neighbourhood has not one, but **two border crossings** to the United States and Peace Arch Provincial Park actually straddles the border! The park is home to the **Peace Arch Monument**, a structure that was erected in 1921 and commemorates the lasting peace between Canada and our friends to the South.




If you're the type of traveller who likes to take their *coffee to-go* and enjoy that *local* brew al fresco, South Surrey is the neighbourhood for you. With waterfront walkways and a *beachy, laid back atmosphere*, here are some ideas on how to get the best out of your South Surrey stay.



See Peruse Crescent Beach (12160 Beecher Street) and feel the sand between your toes and the fresh bay air on your skin. Walk the boardwalk, explore the shops and ice cream parlours, and if you're lucky, you may even be able to spot a starfish or two when the tide is out.







With the Pacific Ocean at our toes, water activities are essential to a Surrey summer. Visit the Crescent Beach Paddle Shack (3136 McBride Avenue) to rent paddleboards or kayaks and head out on the water to explore Boundary Bay and the Nicomekl River.



Shopping is made exponentially more enjoyable in the fresh air of the **Shops at Morgan Crossing** (15765 Croydon Drive). With mens and ladies fashion stores like Roots, Winners, and Lululemon, there's a little something for every type of shopper.



My Shanti (15869 Croydon Drive) by famed Chef Vikram Vij offers a unique dinner menu of cuisines from his travels across India. This intimate and beautifully decorated restaurant is the perfect place to try a new dish.



Discover Surrey's craft distillery scene at Mainland Whisky (107 - 3425 189 Street). With an extensive portfolio of spirits ranging from classic whiskys and cordials to popular cocktails in a bottle, sample for taste and take home a bottle, or two for at-home imbibing.



Dirk | Line up a flight at one of the **craft breweries on the South of the Fraser Ale Trail**. Neighbouring White Rock joins Surrey on the trail with three breweries perfect for kicking back with a locally brewed beverage.

Eat | Breakfast is the most important meal of the day, so fill up on waffles, wraps, and breakfast sandwiches at Prado Cafe (13475 103 Avenue). It goes without saying that picking up a freshly brewed coffee or handcrafted latte made with 49th Parallel Coffee is a must.



See | From concrete jungle to urban oasis, enjoy the gardens at Holland Park (13428 Old Yale Road). Featuring a beautiful waterfall and a blooming river, these manicured gardens are beautiful year-round, and often host cultural, musical, and community events.



See | From one gorgeous park to another, Green Timbers Urban Forest is home to a family-favourite: The Surrey Nature Centre (14225 Green Timbers Way). Enjoy drop-in activities, or pick up a Discovery Backpack to make your walk through the forest even more exciting! Free fishing rod rentals are available for the nearby Green Timbers Lake.



Eat | Family run and a little off the beaten path, the Guacamole Mexican Grill (10671A King George Blvd) serves authentic Mexican cuisine with a smile. Known their mouthwateringly good meals you can't go wrong with their tacos or really, anything from the menu. And be sure to order the horchata, a creamy, cinnamon-spiced traditional Mexican drink. Your tastebuds will thank you.



See | Creativity flows at the Surrey Art Gallery (13750 **88 Avenue)**. The second-largest public art gallery in Metro Vancouver plays host to local artists and international travelling exhibitions while fostering the love of art through art classes, workshops and sketching in the gallery sessions.



Enjoy a well-deserved dinner after a day of discovery at Dominion Kitchen and Bar (D1-13475 Central Avenue). Celebrating Canadian cuisine, Dominion features a menu filled with shared plates, making this a great venue for date night.

Eat | This unassuming coffee shop, Republica Coffee Roasters (102 5674 176 Street) is the perfect place to grab a cup of coffee and chat with friends. The space is cozy and inviting, the coffee is locally roasted in neighbouring Fort Langley, and the treats are tasty.



Stroll through **Downtown Cloverdale's streets (176** Street between 56A and 58 Avenue) and pop into the unique, independently owned shops. From home decor to vintage shops and everything in-between, there's a lot to discover, so be sure to wear your walking shoes!



See | Honeybee Centre (7480 176 Street) is not only a working honeybee farm, but they also have a wonderful "all things bees and honey" shop, honey tasting and even an observation hive to hunt for the elusive queen bee. And "bee" sure to check their events schedule for workshops and family programming.



The Surrey Museum (17710 56A Avenue) is a great place to explore Surrey's history. Kiddos will get a kick out of the Kids Gallery that teaches little ones all about sustainability in a fun, interactive way.



Eat 8 Discover a new brew, or two at Hawthorne Beer Drink | Market (5633 176 Street) for dinner. Enjoy a diverse menu of West Coast features like mussels and seafood pastas, pizzas, burgers, and salads, all complimented by an extensive beer menu for craft beer lovers.



Test your luck at **Elements Casino Surrey (17755 60** Avenue), and take in a live band, or special event on the weekend in one of their many lounges.



For a fun and unique dining experience, look no further The Vault (5764 176 Street). The restaurant was an old bank in a former life and still uses the original vault as a private dining room. They're loved locally for their quirky decor, mouthwatering steaks and peanut butter pie.



With handmade ice cream using local, natural ingredients Dukes Fine Ice Cream (#104 - 6758 188 **Street)** has won a spot in the hearts of Surrey's ice cream lovers. Enjoy classic favourites and rotating seasonal flavours showcasing local producers.



Eat | Fuel up for the day at Cuatro Coffee (9014 152 Street) for breakfast. With a relaxed, comfortable decor and baristas who make your morning latte just how you like it, this little cafe embodies the true heart of Fleetwood.



Visit the Godwin Farm Biodiversity Preserve (9016 164 Street), and discover the groves of Sequoias, Redwoods, Firs and many other species of trees that were planted by the Godwin family. Explore the many trails lined with heritage trees and ponds home to a variety of wildlife.



Think | Finest Cup Coffee (109 8645 160th Street) is quietly taking on the java giants, and winning! The owner hails from Ethiopia, the birthplace of coffee, and sees coffee as more than just a drink, it's an extension of his culture. Order, then sit and enjoy your coffee and the vibes - this is not a grab and run shop.



Pick up some picnic supplies from **Fresh Street** Market (15930 Fraser Highway) and head to one of our favourite picnic spots and embrace Surrey's greenery while enjoying lunch in the great outdoors.



 $\mathcal{D}_{\mathbf{0}}$ | Pack a little adventure into your day at **Ambush** Paintball (7550 160 Street). Team up with your friends and choose from four different fields to play on, including The Castle Moat, Ambush City, The Lost Forest, and Grassy Mounds.



Enjoy dinner in the calm and cozy atmosphere of Assini's Greek Restaurant (109 - 15551 Fraser Hwv). With a menu of traditional Greek cuisine as well as mouthwatering pizzas and pastas, even the pickiest of eaters will find a meal they love.



See | Known for its impressive tulip displays and a classic labyrinth, Fleetwood Gardens (15802 80 Avenue) are beautiful during any season of the year. Early spring promises beautiful white magnolias and pink camellias in bloom, and groves of over 50 red maples are in bloom in May.

Eat | The pastries at Mann & Co (13411 71a Avenue) are as stunning as they are delicious. Classic French baking meets South Asian flavours and it is almost impossible to decide what to order ... so you're going to want to try one of everything.



See | Spend the morning embracing your artistic side at the Surrey Arts Centre (13750 88 Avenue). The Arts Centre is home to the Surrey Civic Theatres, the Surrey Art Gallery, and numerous public art installations, all nestled into the serene surroundings of Bear Creek Park.



Enjoy a mix of street food and North Indian cuisine at Chacha's Tandoor & Grill (101 - 12855 80 Avenue) There's a saying, "Nothing brings people together like good food" and at Chacha's, the goal is to make sure that every bite makes you want to go back for more!



Think | Surrey's very own winery, Vinoscenti Vineyards (15560 Colebrook Road) can be found in the Newton neighbourhood. With tours of the grounds available, complete with a tasting room, and an array of events, there's always something happening at the winery.



Hit the links at Birdie's and Buckets Family Golf Centre (5228 King George Boulevard). Not only is there a large driving range to perfect your swing, the course is comprised of a nine hole pitch and putt for a casual game to tune up your skills.



Eat Make it an evening to remember with an exquisite meal at the Old Surrey Restaurant (13483 72 Avenue). This cosy restaurant is inside a 100 year old heritage home, making for a beautiful and romantic ambiance as you enjoy your classic French cuisine.



Think | Wrap up the day with a stop at Russell Brewing Company's (100 - 13108 80 Avenue) new tasting room on the South of the Fraser Ale Trail. Every brew is made with natural ingredients in small batches to ensure that only the best makes it into your glass.



The Guildford neighbourhood is plentiful in *gorgeous greenery* just waiting to be discovered. From *hiking trails* to *nature in* surprising spaces, we've put together a funfilled day in Guildford.



Eat | Nestled in a residential neighbourhood of North Surrey, **Cafe Rosen (103 - 10422 168 Street)** is a simple, sweet little cafe with baked-from-scratch treats and a most excellent latte ... try the iced "blue latte". Stop in for lunch, or indulge in a homemade cookie or slice of the lemon loaf.



See | Discover North America's largest living wall just outside of Guildford Town Centre (10355 152 Street). Comprised of 45,000 individual plants across 110 species, the pedestrian overpass when driving eastbound on 104 Ave is now a stunning piece of public art. Guildford Town Centre has two smaller living walls inside the shopping center.



 $\mathcal{E}at$ | Hidden away in a food court, **YLs Curry Bowl** (15277 100 Avenue) is an unassuming eatery offering incredibly delicious Malaysian food. Regulars rave about the Hainanese chicken and the curry laksa noodles are truly crave-worthy!



See | Get a little gardening inspiration at **Port Kells** Nurseries (18730 88 Avenue). Breathe in the fresh air as you browse through their extensive plant catalogue, and take advantage of their knowledgeable staff members when thinking of your own gardening needs.



Eat | Treat yourself to a delicious meal at **Sabai Thai** Restaurant (10391 150 Street) for dinner. Serving wholesome meals made from traditional recipes and fresh ingredients, eating tapas-style is a great way to try a variety of dishes.





Head into Green Timbers Urban Forest, one of Surrey's largest parks to do a little bird watching in the 183 hectares of wetland, lakes, grassland, meadows, and nature trails. A stop on the South Fraser Bird Trail, Green Timbers is ideal for spotting a variety of birds like woodpeckers, eagles, and Cedar Waxwings.

Urban Forest

Surrey's story is closely tied to trees. Our trees serve as a connection to the past, present and the future, protecting them is a priority. Although most of Surrey's forests are second growth, you can still find some impressive giants if you know where to look. Our urban forests are a peaceful escape from the energy of the city and home to a wide variety of wildlife seeking refuge.

Common sightings are bald eagles, ducks, salamanders, barred owls, woodpeckers, coyotes and native Douglas squirrels.

Bird Walching

Did you know that over 200 species of birds call Surrey home? Surrey is on the BC Bird Trail, so grab your binoculars and your camera, download a birding app like Merlin or BirdNET and see how many different bird species you can spot! And once you've spotted your birds, be sure to upload your sightings to eBird, a global citizen databasedriven bird watching resource. Not only can you upload your finds, but

you can also use eBird to discover what birds to look out for in Surrey's bird-watching spots.

A visit to Metro Vancouver isn't complete without sampling some of the region's libations. Surrey is home to a diverse collection of breweries, distilleries, and wineries, each with their own unique offerings and all making their mark on BC's craft beverage scene.

The art of distilling is alive and well in Surrey with distillers creating expertly crafted whisky, gin, rum, makgeolli, a rice wine, and baiju, a Chinese spirit. And as far as wine goes? Well, Surrey is home to a small collection of boutique wineries and... one of BC's top sommeliers.

We love a good trail... the South of the Fraser Ale Trail, however, is not your typical walk in the park. There are stunning views and a lot of adventure, plus the bonus of a BC specialty: craft beer. Surrey's brewmasters have put themselves on the map with award winning ales, lagers, and specialty beers. The BC Ale Trail highlights



some of the best breweries in our beautiful province, and Surrey has collaborated with our neighbouring communities Richmond, Delta, and White Rock to celebrate just how well we brew it "South of the Fraser" with an Ale Trail to call our own.

Most of Surrey's wineries, breweries and distilleries have tasting rooms so you can make a day out of trying... but we know that you'll end up buying.
